FIRST QUARTER REPORT 2017

Child2Youth Foundation has managed to tackle some pressing challenges in different communities as per its strategic plan through Child Sponsorship, Community Development, Health and Water and Sanitation though there still some threats on the way. Through those programs, some beneficiaries have benefited directly and others indirectly. Most daily needs for children, families and communities have been handled by the organization thus improving economically and educationally. Below were some of the results in each program.

1. CHILD SPONSORSHIP:

The program is still going on providing scholastic materials and school fees to all sponsored children. Children are sponsored at each level i.e. Primary, Secondary, Tertiary and University which has encouraged them to read harder to achieve their ambitions. The program has a challenge of some children dropping out but as a Foundation, we're still making a follow up on them.

So far the performance is still good for most children as per beginning of term exams though we had four children who repeated classes for last term.

Schools like Sanga P/S, Najja education Centre and Kanonko Parents P/S received text books from the Foundation as photos below show with some school administrators.







The girls' dormitory is on its final stage of construction at Kanonko P/S and boarding pupils are being registered for next term entry. The dormitory consists of a gallery, matron's room and sick bay.

The number of school going children is increasing in schools like Buyomba Community Academy P/S and Kanonko Parents P/S because of the services now available but there is need for more desks.

The Foundation also managed to cement two class room blocks at Ssanganzira Primary school.

The Foundation also donated twenty bags of cement to Busagazi Victoria Wing Primary School.

2. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

Committees are still doing well their roles which have enabled beneficiaries to access services like medication, cleanliness, trainings on good animal feeds and shelter construction which have been improved as seen below.





Much progress is observed in piggery, goat and lastly cattle since they take long to give birth compared to pigs and goats. For instance Kyambogo community has 42goats, 14 cows and 23 pigs. Some of these projects were visited by TRUE Africa team as observed below;



3. HEALTH

St. Joseph's clinic is still providing services through Out Patients Department (OPD) and maternity department. The services are good which has enabled the clinic have a high turn up of patients especially at Out patients Department (OPD) which has received patients with Malaria, Hypertension, cough & Flu, Typhoid, Urinary tract infections and Arthritis.

Immunization is still going on with expectant mothers and children being immunized Tetanus, Polio, Measles, Whooping cough and other immunizable diseases.

Out Patients Department (OPD) received patients and maternity ward received mothers of which gave birth and were referred for further management since they had complications.

4. WATER AND SANITATION

Rural communities are still accessing safe clean water through the protected spring wells constructed by the Foundation and for this quarter another Sanga protected spring well in Najja Sub County was constructed. Latrines are in good state with tip taps.

Communities are still having a center of ownership for water projects and are in position of maintaining them through water user committees.

5. VISITORS

As a Foundation, we received visitors from U.S.A (TRUE Africa) represented by Madam Rachael and Melissa in February who visited homes and schools in different codes. These got involved in scholastic material distribution in different schools, home visiting, profile making, project visiting and even gave out gifts to some sponsored children as seen below:

- ♣ Some new children were registered in some schools but are still pending without sponsors.
- ♣ Some sponsored children received gifts from their sponsored.
- ♣ A number of sponsored children joining university this year has increased.
- ♣ Projects are multiplying especially those with goat and piggery projects.
- ♣ Protected spring wells are being extended to communities for safe drinking water.

8. CHALLENGES:

- ♣ Girls are dropping out of schools after becoming pregnant and this is due to parents/guardians negligence.
- ♣ More children are still in need of education sponsorship in all the codes or areas of operation.
- ♣ The Foundation faces a problem of limited funds to fully facilitate its programs.
- ♣ Some Parents/guardians have become reluctant thus living their children with the Foundation.

9. WAY FORWARD

- ★ We shall need an external intervention for more counseling and guidance to children especially girls.
- **♣** Water user committees will still be reminded to maintain the wells.
- ♣ More external counseling and guidance is to be emphasized because girls are still dropping out of schools after becoming pregnant.
