

HEALTH

Health program had a big turn-up of patients at the clinic this year especially OPD Department.

The clinic also registered an increase in the monthly diabetic and hyper/hypo tension patients though sadly one died recently.

Immunization is still being done on monthly basis for expectant mothers and children. The turn up has been good and mothers are sensitized on proper and safe breast feeding plus its importance. Diseases mostly treated include malaria, peptic ulcers, respiratory tract infections, Cough, Flu, measles, Chicken pox and Hypertension.

There was also a health camp at the clinic conducted by medical officials from USA in addition to our local health officers which took place in June, the turn was so good. Clients with High/Low blood pressure, Ulcers, Skin Infections, Malaria, Diabetes among others were well treated.

TRUE Africa team also visited the Foundation programs where four new schools were visited in anticipation for construction plans which included Spring of Hope P/S, Muyubwe Landing Site, Ssangazira P/S and St. Bonefance P/s. Among these Muyumbwe Landing site school was given the first priority because it had many pupils who were too needy, vulnerable with no school in the area.







During their visit, some new children were registered in schools like Kanonko P/S, Lugasa P/S and Buyomba Parents P/S and a few have got sponsors unlike others who were still pending.

Schools like Kanonko and Buyomba were provided with school supplies which included footballs, Chalk, Text books, Pencils and Pens.

Home visits were made where some sponsored children were provided with beddings, towels, skipping ropes, Balls, beans, clothes, food and mosquito nets. More so some children with goats were visited and these were found in good health.

- ❖ We still need support for those HIV positive children who are on ARVs since they need good feeding, that is, a balanced diet.

WAY FORWARD

❖ We're continuing in such of partners/sponsors for more funding.

For unruly children, we are working hand in hand with parents and disciplinary committees in schools so that our children can be dealt with accordingly.
